Moment of Silence

The Board of Education had a moment of silence tonight to honor all those who have been lost in our education community over the past few weeks, including our own Denise Lycos.

Presentation

Brian Grew provided an update on the Student Support Services' Itinerant Services group.

Action Items

The Board approved the Consent Docket as follows:

In other action, the Board:

- Adopted the revised East Lansing ASD classroom calendar for 2024-2025 as presented.
- Approved an increase of \$175,000 in the bid purchase of office and classroom furniture for the 2024-25 school year from Kentwood Office Furniture through the TIPS Cooperative for a total amount not to exceed \$275,000.
- Approved the Annual Summer Tax Resolution to collect a 100% Summer Tax levy for the tax year 2025 (fiscal year 2025-26), continuing from year-to-year until specifically revoked by the Board.
- Authorized the Superintendent to execute an agreement with Clinton County RESA for early childhood specialist services for an estimated amount of \$60,000 through June 30, 2025.
- Approved the resolution to join the lawsuit against insulin manufacturers and other defendants charged
 with artificially inflating the cost of insulin prices on the terms specified in the Attorney-Client Fee
 Contract as presented.
- Approved the request for a 2.0 FTE increase for Parent Educators as presented.



• Approved an increase not to exceed \$50,000 in the contract with LJ Trumble Group of Lansing, MI for additional painting services within the leased space at the Beekman Center. The scope of this modification includes areas such as the secondary commons, secondary classrooms, music room and wall panels in the gymnasiums. This adjustment will bring the total contract amount for painting services at the Beekman Center to a maximum of \$100,000.
